2016 General Election - Results

Illinois remained a blue state in a red sea after the results of the 2016 election, which favored Republicans nationally. Donald Trump will be sworn in on January 20 as the country's 45th president.

In Illinois, Democratic challenger Tammy Duckworth ousted Republican incumbent Mark Kirk for his U.S. Senate seat, making Illinois' U.S. Senate representation fully Democratic. She will be sworn in on January 3, 2017.

In the 10th Congressional District, Democrat Brad Schneider defeated Republican incumbent Robert Dold. This will change Illinois' Congressional delegation from 10 Democrats and 8 Republicans to 11 Democrats and 7 Republicans in the 115th Congress.

Democratic candidate Susana Mendoza defeated Republican Leslie Munger (who was appointed by Governor Bruce Rauner) for the position of Illinois Comptroller. Comptroller-elect Mendoza will be sworn in on December 5.

The legislature voted to add a constitutional amendment question on the November ballot, and it passed. The so-called "lockbox amendment" will prevent the state from taking monies from

transportation revenues (garnered from the gas tax, tolls, and license fees) to use for anything other than transportation purposes, such as road construction. Recently, the state has tapped those and other special funds to help balance the deficit-ridden budget. Proponents of the amendment said it would keep Illinois' infrastructure safe while opponents said the state needs the financial flex-



ibility to use special funds for other purposes occasionally. Moody's rated the amendment's passage as "credit negative."

The 100th General Assembly will be sworn in at noon on Wednesday, January 11, 2017. The next pages contain the complete, unofficial listing for the 100th Illinois General Assembly.
